Aleksandra Stoilova was clearly the outstanding performer when she won the 100m title in a new p.b. of 11.60 seconds, elevating her to number 2 in the Australian U18 rankings and number 22 in the World. She recently announced she has accepted a full Scholarship to Pittsburgh University in the USA and will be leaving in January of 2023. We wish her all the best.

Molly Goetz was on the sidelines with a shoulder injury for over a month leading up to the trip to Adelaide. Accordingly her silver medal performance in hammer was exceptionally rewarding. Molly's brother Alex also won the hammer Silver medal just short of his best, however was extremely disappointed with the discus where he failed to put out a fair throw having been ranked number 3 in the event, prior to the competition.

Amelia Darek was ranked 4 in Australia in hammer, however was not selected from her result at the NSW All Schools. Instead, she gained selection in the Pole Vault (a new event for her) and miraculously came home with the Bronze medal in what was only her 2nd ever competition.

Jaxson Horton was brilliant in finishing just out of a podium spot with a massive personal best result in the 3000m walk. Zoe Sarris also scored a personal best jump of 2.55m in the pole vault for a fantastic 5th placing in the U15 event.
